

Dear Caucus Leader:

Welcome to the Wichita Conference. This year the NWPC is focusing on the hundreds of women who are running for office with its WIN WITH WOMEN '74 campaign. Combined with the new citizen groups waging successful battles in the Congress, the state legislatures, and in city halls, the emergence of the woman candidate in elections unencumbered by bad habits and old obligations, is the surest sign that citizenship is alive and well again in America.

The goal of WIN WITH WOMEN '74 (and continuing into 1976) is to take the mystery out of campaigning for new and less experienced candidates. To this end we have developed and continue to develop nuts and bolts materials especially helpful to women running for local races for the first time.

We are developing a national committee which will identify experienced people to act as campaign consultants both paid and volunteers for women candidates.

We are establishing a national college intern program which will channel college students into women's campaigns.

We have set up two national media committees — one on each coast — to bring news of women's political activities to the press, radio and television.

We are equipping our state and local caucuses with "how-to" kits of campaign materials, and we are providing a clearing-house for demographics on women candidates.

We have developed a legal task force composed of volunteer lawyers who will give their time to help solve the legal problems of women candidates.

The NWPC also wants to help establish new standards for candidate conduct in campaigns. WIN WITH WOMEN '74 will encourage women candidates to adhere to model campaign finance disclosure practices, even when these model practices far exceed the requirements of statutes. We will encourage women to take positive stands on issues — at a time when so many races are personality contests devoid of substance.

The women candidates of 1974 exemplify the change taking place in American politics. Their campaigns will be models to follow in the politics of tomorrow.

The Beginning. . .

The National Women's Political Caucus, a multipartisan organization, was formed in July, 1971, to awaken, organize, and assert the vast political power represented by women — 53% of the population — by:

- organizing state and local caucuses around the country;
- raising women's issues at every level of the political process;
- electing to office women committed to women's concerns;
- educating women through political action.

Successes To Date. . .

- over 300 active caucuses around the country comprising some 50,000 members;
- increase in women delegates to national conventions from 13% Democratic and 17% Republican in '68 to 40% and 30%, respectively, in '72;
- held first national women's political convention in over 100 years drawing more than 1500 women to Houston, Texas in 1973;
- testified before U.S. House and Senate Committees on issues of concern to women including reform of campaign financing;
- working in coalitions to pass ERA around the country.
